Health Department reminds, “Don't dump old TVs in landfill; recycle it free”

(Salt Lake County) – With the nationwide switch to digital TV now in effect as of today, Salt Lake Valley Health Department (SLVHD) environmental health experts want to remind residents that, if you are getting rid of your old TV because of the digital transition, don't pitch it. Recycle it.

Residents can drop off their unwanted analog TVs and other old electronic waste (e-waste) at any of the SLVHD permanent collection facilities (see addresses below) at no charge, instead of throwing them in the trash which is potentially bad for the environment.

“We have been receiving literally tons of old television sets since about the first of this year,” explained Dorothy Adams, HHW Program Manager. “It’s not only the wise thing to do, it’s the right thing to do – for our environment and our community.”
