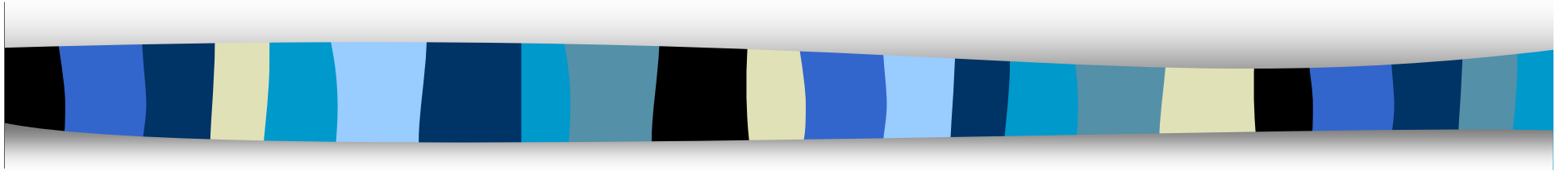
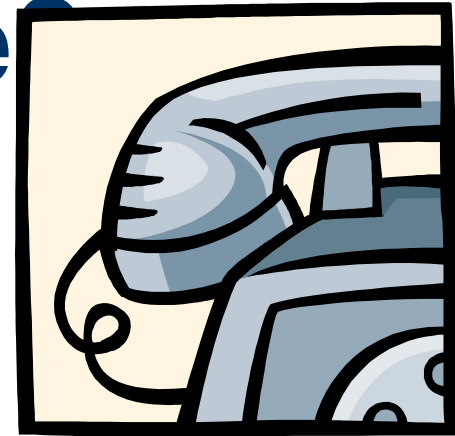

Communication System

What Is Vial of Life



- Emergency medical communication system linked to 9-1-1 dispatch agencies
- Administered by S.L.Valley Health Dept.
- Available to Salt Lake County residents
- Valuable for persons with chronic conditions and/or multiple medications

How To Sign-up



- Basic form available from Salt Lake Valley Health Department (call 313-6606)
- First page (white) requests name, address, phone & birthdate
- Information is forwarded to Valley Emergency Communication Center for county residents or to SLC Fire Dept. for Salt Lake City residents

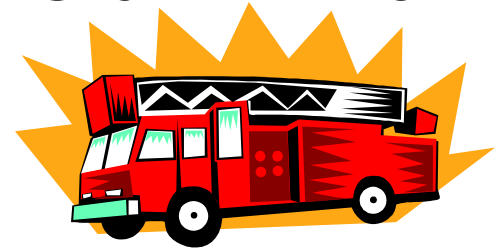
Personal Medical Information

- Second form (yellow) requests medical information, such as chronic conditions, medicine allergies & medicine location
- Goes into large marked medicine bottle
- Then into the refrigerator, a universal location
- Top shelf, right side (instructions on form)



How Does the Program Work?

- A registered participant calls 9-1-1 from his/her home with emergency medical need
- Dispatch is notified with “Vial of Life” indicator on computer screen
- The dispatcher tells EMS personnel to locate vial & access information

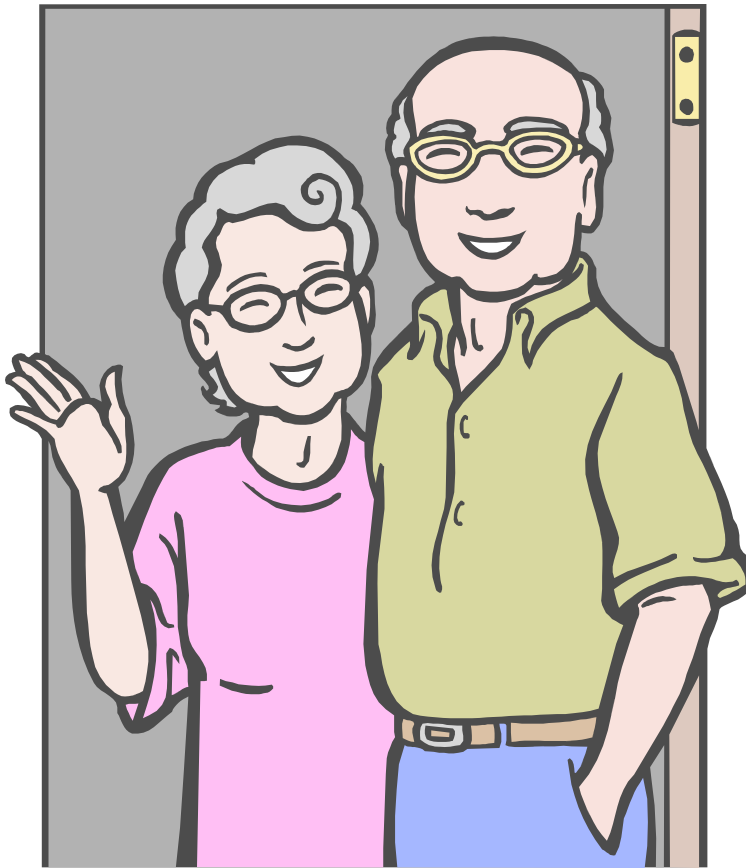


Important Considerations

- Vial of Life is linked through address & phone number, so info is annually updated by reminder mailing
- Personal information is confidential
- S.L.County Aging Services previously managed program – original participants must sign-up again
